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What are Targeted Case Management Services?

- Case managers work with children and their families to help them meet their future goals.
- Case managers provide services that will help to promote successful outcomes for children and their families.
- Services are designed to be responsive to the goals and needs identified by the families and the support team.

What Families Can Expect:

- The goal of targeted case management services is to include families in the development of treatment goals for the child and the family as a whole.
- Case managers will meet with the family to complete initial assessments to help identify the strengths and needs of the family.
- Case managers will meet with families in the home to develop service plans, identify community resources and advocate for needed supports.
- Families can expect to meet with their case managers minimally two times per month, or more, based on the needs of the child and family.

Eligibility Criteria:

- The child must be between the ages of 0-20 years.
- The child must have serious emotional or behavioral needs that interfere with their level of functioning in the home or community.
- The child must also be eligible for Maine Care health insurance.
- The family must be willing to participate in services.
