ON OPIOID USE DISORDER & TRAIN THE TRAINER WORKSHOPS

Two-part workshop designed to reduce stigma and support recovery in our community.

AMHC, in partnership with UR Medicine Recovery Center of Excellence, is presenting the "Community Conversations on Opioid Use Disorder & Train the Trainer Workshops." This two-part series aims to reduce stigma around substance use disorder (SUD) in rural communities, improving access to support and treatment. The workshops will be held on three dates across Aroostook County, accessible to community members, service providers, and those with lived experience. Participants completing an evaluation will be entered into a \$50 Amazon gift card drawing.

Part One: Community Conversations

- Engages participants in discussions beyond traditional academic approaches.
- Uses portraits and videos to explore stigma and support for those affected by SUD.
- Provides a space for collaboration on reducing stigma in communities.

Part Two: Train the Trainer Workshop

- A 4-hour session on the Community Conversations curriculum.
- Focuses on developing facilitation skills for delivering the workshop locally.
- Guides participants in creating actionable plans to reduce stigma and foster recovery.
